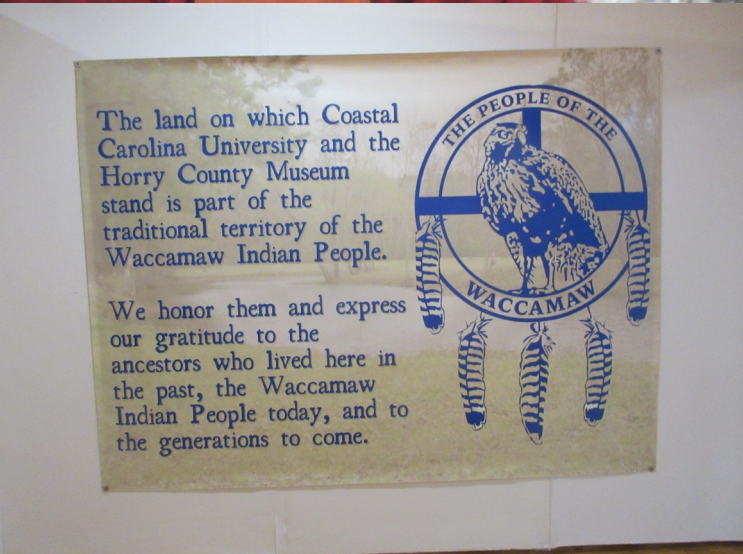


Live Oak Trees in the City of Conway!!

The Waccamaw Indian People

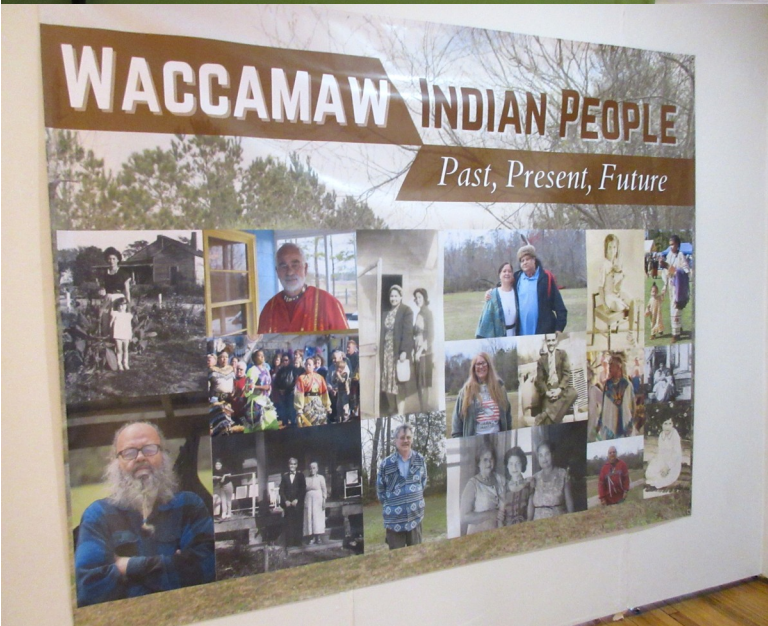
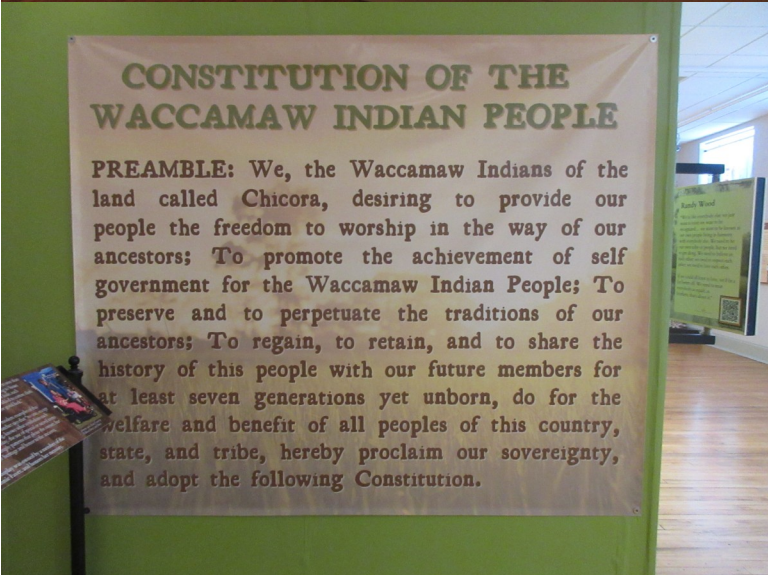
On July 31st, Bob & I attended a presentation at the Museum, where *Chief Harold Hatcher* gave a talk on the Waccamaw Indian People. Chief Hatcher has an impressive history, not just with the Waccamaw Indian people, but also in the US Army where he served for 20 years. You can find much detailed information on line on his life experiences. He became Chief of the Waccamaw Indians in 1992 and continues in that position today. It is through the Conway Museum that we were able to learn about the Chief and the part he and all the Waccamaw Indians played in the the History of South Carolina. This was their land before we moved in.

I have included a few pictures I took in the museum, where the history of the Waccamaw Indians is told. They struggle to keep their Identity while living in the society we pushed on to them!
